Dear Parents,

Remote Learning

With yesterday's announcement of an extension to remote learning for the rest of term 3 (insert my tears here) I congratulate you and your children on the hard work and persistence to get this far. Today I have been involved in part 2 of the Education State Principal Conference. Experts and educators acknowledge the difficulties surrounding remote learning. Very few families would choose this as the preferred option. Overwhelmingly the advice and research is showing that the most important things that you can do to assist your children are to provide support, encouragement, structure and routine. Some ways that you can do this in our setting are to ensure that your child is up dressed in school uniform and online for their WebEx meeting, engaged in their literacy and numeracy session, and getting back into their meeting if they have any questions or need help with their learning. Maintaining the structure as close to a school day as possible has allowed our students to transition from remote learning back to school easily and stay connected with teachers and peers. Once again I acknowledge how difficult this is for everyone but implore you to hang tough; our students who are engaged and completing tasks are overwhelmingly making good progress.

Foundation (Prep) Enrolments

We are now accepting enrolments for 2022. If you have a child starting school next year, or know someone who is thinking of joining our school community, please contact Amy in the office. We are starting to plan transition days and we don't want anyone to miss out on the opportunity of participating in these important days for children and parents.

Attendance During Remote Learning

Schools are required to maintain attendance registers during remote learning, and our office staff have been tasked with following up on any unexplained absence. If your child is unwell or there are other pressing family issues, please add an attendance note on Compass to let your child's classroom teacher know that they won't be engaging online that day. We encourage you to also write something in the comments section of the attendance note so that we can ensure the correct attendance code has been used.

NAPLAN

Schools received NAPLAN results this week and yet again the majority of our students scored above the state average. With the disruptions of Covid and remote learning this is further evidence that our program is comprehensive and how important it is to have your children participating every day. NAPLAN results will go home in packs with students on Monday.

OSHC Survey

As you may be aware, the school council has elected to put the Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) service out to tender. This is in order to formalise the agreement and to ensure that the school community is getting the best OSHC for our needs. This survey is not intended as a review of the existing provider but as a means to discover what is important to the school community. As such, it would be greatly appreciated if you are able to provide some feedback and direction to make certain that the needs of many families as possible can be addressed. Even if you do not currently use OSHC, your input would be welcome.


