### **Mobile Phone and Smartwatch Policy**

The Department of Education has enacted a mandatory policy for mobile devices for all schools. The policy allows schools to make the final determination in regards to what mobile/cellular devices are included. Our School Council met last night and discussed, at length, what to include in our policy and at the end of the night it was decided that we include mobile phones and smart watches, as these have similar capabilities.

The NGPS Mobile Devices Policy is available for everyone to read on the school website and conforms to DET guidelines. Basically, if your child brings a mobile device to school (other than a BYOD iPad) it must be put away and not accessed during school hours. The device may be kept securely in a school bag, or handed into the classroom teacher who will secure it away, until home time. There are possible exemptions available, mainly for medical/health reasons, and anyone wanting an exemption needs to contact me directly.

The Mobile Devices Policy also needs to be considered together with the Personal Goods Policy – also a mandated policy from DET. Schools are required to let parents know at the start of each year that anything of value that children bring to school is done at their own risk. So, if you allow your child to bring a mobile phone to school and keep it in their bag but the bag, then falls to the ground, gets stepped on, and the phone is broken, there is no school insurance policy and the liability is all yours. I have also put this policy up on the school website.

Finally, if parents need to contact their children please do so through the school office. Don't send notifications via their BYOD. Students are not supposed to have any notification software operating at school on any devices. If the message is important then we probably need to know it also in case plans go awry and Plan B needs to be implemented. Technology is a wonderful thing but it can be a pain in the proverbial if it starts constantly encroaching on everyday life

### **School Council Elections**

There are five parent vacancies for this year's School Council. Details on the election timeline and self-nomination process are attached to this newsletter and will also be sent out again via Compass on Friday. In essence, if you would like to be a part of the NGPS School Council you need to pick up a self-nomination form from the front office from Monday 17<sup>th</sup> February (next Monday) and return it to the office by 4.00pm Monday 24<sup>th</sup> February. School Council meets another 8 times this year – at 7.00pm on a Tuesday evening. Meetings finish by around 8.30pm. Please feel free to give me a call if you have any questions.

### **Start of the School Day**

The music for the children to start heading into class goes at 8.52am. The bell itself goes at 8.55am. Teachers generally try to open their doors around 8.45am. However, I do run staff briefing meetings on a Wednesday morning from 8.30am and other committees also meet on various mornings — Wellbeing Committee (8.15am), School Improvement Team (8.00am), etc. Two teachers are also on yard duty from 8.40am till the bell goes. Students shouldn't be at school prior to 8.40am as the yard is not supervised! Therefore, please don't expect your child's teacher to open their doors before 8.45am. They might open a bit earlier during winter on cold, wet mornings. If you need to drop your child off at school early because you need to get to work on time, please use the Out of School Hours Care facility.

### Stranger Danger

Whilst I'm not officially aware of anything untoward taking place in or around New Gisborne, it is always wise for parents to speak with their children about not talking to, or approaching, strangers. Parents parking in and around the school are also asked to be vigilant for any suspicious cars or people lurking about. If you have any concerns please notify the school immediately or, if you deem necessary, the police. Be alert but not alarmed!


### **Picking Up Your Children**

It has been noticed that some students are being picked up out on Ferrier Road standing on the side of the road. Yes, the car park can be busy and congested for about 15-20 minutes but 90% of cars are gone by 3.30pm. However, it is incredibly dangerous to have a child walk out of the school grounds by themselves, navigate their way between cars parked on the side of Ferrier Road and stand and wait to be picked up. Teachers on yard duty after school collect any remaining children in the grounds about 3.45 to 3.50pm and we take them inside until they are picked up. We don't know, or see, kids that are 50m up Ferrier Road!

### **Working with Children Checks**

It is policy that everyone volunteering at New Gisborne PS have a current Working with Children Check. These are free and can be sourced online. Please remember that you need to nominate New Gisborne Primary School as the organisation you will be supporting. When you nominate our school **we** receive a certificate saying you are allowed to volunteer at the school. My staff are expected to check the WWC status of all their volunteers on the master list we keep in the office.
