Dear Parents,

I'm sure that parents and workers across Victoria are waiting with bated breath for the Government's blueprint for recovery to be announced this weekend. This morning's headlines in the Herald Sun had me thinking someone had actually leaked the document early but, according to the Premier, this was an outdated draft which has been changed significantly over recent weeks.

In terms of schools resuming face-to-face teaching, I have not been provided with any information by the Department of Education and, along with all other Victorians, I'll be following the media closely this weekend. My hope is that schools resume on-site learning from the start of Term 4 but we'll just have to wait a few days longer to see what is announced.

Remote Learning

As we approach the last fortnight of remote learning prior to the September break, I urge parents to 'hang in there' and keep your children engaged in their learning. I'm sure they are getting tired (as I'm sure you are too) and it's harder to keep them on task. However, once we hit the holidays there will be two weeks of having a real decent break. Downing tools, so to speak, a week or two early will make for an exceptionally long break that might take longer to get back on track from. Keep to the routine of remote learning for as long as possible over this last fortnight please.

Parent Survey

Thank you to all those families that completed and submitted a Parent Survey. I will be collating the comments from the surveys and sharing some of the common themes in the next week or so. We actually printed up all the names of families that submitted a survey, cut them up and put them in a humungous barrel (Tupperware container actually) and drew out one name for the Baringo \$100 Dinner for Two voucher. Congratulations Sarah and Jon Steinfort - you're our winners! The school will be in contact with you shortly letting you know how to claim your prize. If you don't hear from us then just assume Mr West and I couldn't contact you so we decided to make use of the voucher ourselves!

Oval Works

The major redevelopment of the school oval will begin within weeks. We're hoping that by the time we return to school, on or about 5th October if all goes to plan, the work will be well underway. The top layer of soil down to about 30cm will be removed and drainage and a crushed rock base laid down. This will be followed by about 8000 sq. m of artificial turf which will include footy and soccer lines, footy posts, soccer gaols, running track, jumping pit and down ball courts. This will be a very exciting time for everyone and, once completed, we will have a brilliant all-weather surface to play on all year round.



We now have 125 students who have completed the VPRC.


