Dear Parents,

Welcome back to Term 4. We were hoping that we would have all been back on site at the start of term but unfortunately, we have to wait a little longer. It was amazing to see our P-2's bounding through the gates this week and I am continually amazed at how resilient they are with the many disruptions that they have had. They are a credit to you and to their teachers who have had them quickly settled and back into core learning from Monday. Term 4 is usually a very busy time with transition programs, camps, graduation and whole school concert. At this time, all of these programs have been cancelled or modified. We will keep you updated as soon as we are aware of changes to the operational guidelines. Thank you all for your continued support as we all work through and support the children together.

### **Covid Regulations**

The Victorian Government has announced a staged return to onsite learning in Term 4, with all students planned to return onsite by Tuesday 26th October. From the start of term until the return of all students onsite, schools will operate both onsite and remote learning. We will continue to follow the recommendations of the Victorian Chief Health Officer. These include:

- All unwell staff and students must stay home. If your child develops symptoms of a fever, chills or sweats, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of smell or taste they should get tested at a coronavirus testing facility and stay home. This helps everyone.
- Social distancing between adults.
- Non-essential personnel are not allowed onsite. If parents must come to the school they are to phone the office and our admin staff will deal with all problems/concerns.
- The children and staff must wash their hands and sanitise regularly.
- All children need to bring a drink bottle to school each day.
- Masks are to be worn inside the building if not teaching.

### Staggered Return to School

Onsite arrangements for the next 2 weeks with the government's plan for return to school next week, we can welcome back Year 3/4/5/6 students for two days each. These arrangements have been put in place to limit the number of people on site.

Monday 11<sup>th</sup> October - Prep, Year 1, Year 2, will be onsite. Years 3/4 and 5/6 will have

their morning check in and then be assigned work while staff plan for the rest of the week.

Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> October - Prep, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3 and Year 4 will be onsite. Years 5/6 will continue with remote learning

Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> October and Friday 15<sup>th</sup> - Prep, Year 1, Year 2, Year 5 and Year 6 will be onsite. Years 3/4 will continue with remote learning.

Repeat until 26<sup>th</sup> October.

Tuesday 26th October - All students return to school onsite.

### **Transition Program**

At this stage we are unable to run our planned transition program. We hope over the coming weeks we will receive new guidelines to enable some sort of modified program. We will keep you updated as we know more.






# YEAR 5 WRITING BLACKOUT POETRY
